
Bird scooters have become more of a nuisance than a benefit to living in this city. The lack of safety standards, especially when it comes to wearing helmets is borderline scary. This past Friday, that scary thought became a real life situation when a young



female was riding one of these scooters around our hotel. She seemed to be enjoying herself, as most do when riding them after a few beverages, when she decided to try and hop the curb. When she attempted this, the front wheel caught the curb causing her to fly off the scooter and hit her head face first on the concrete. The 2 valets working Bob's Steakhouse that evening were getting ready to shut down for the evening when they heard the sound of the accident. They ran over to find that the young woman was unconscious, unresponsive, and surrounded by blood. Multiple people at this point had called 911 as they witnessed it as well. Your son Wes

saw the accident as well and ran to help without thinking twice. Little did everyone know, even myself, he is studying medical sciences at Lipscomb University. Wes was able to assist the woman and help her regain consciousness as well as keeping her conscious by asking her for her name while she laid there waiting for the ambulance to arrive. Paramedics soon arrived and took the woman to Vanderbilt Hospital. Wes went above and beyond his call of duty of being a valet and became nothing short of a hero. Wes showed his truly humble character by not even talking about the situation until he was asked about it. Although he feels he did nothing special what he did was truly remarkable. I am beyond words proud to be the manager of such a brave and selfless individual that is your son. He didn't do this for the recognition, he did it because it is what he truly believed was the right thing. I firmly believe that Wes may have saved this woman's life. Your son is a fantastic employee and an even better human being. I am sure you were aware of how great he is, I just wanted to give you another example. Kindest Regards."
