Introduction to Ministry Model Articles

Transitions can often wear us down, but not always. Consider the excitement surrounding these "transitions" – a wedding, a new birth, a new car or home, a promotion, a retirement. Change can be, and often is, natural, good, and "just what the doctor ordered." Our transition to a new ministry model is upon us. It has been bathed in prayer and carefully thought out. It includes a minister for these three areas: Pastoral Care, Preaching, and Connections. We believe that God is at work and that Derrick, Joey, and Dan will form a great team that will lead our church family into a future of reaching others for God, while maintaining all the things that have made Pitman Road a special place. Over the next few weeks, our bulletin will present a description of each part of our new ministry model. We hope this process will clarify roles, answer questions, and convey our enthusiasm for our ministry team and the work they will do.

Our Pastoral Care Minister



Our pastoral care minister must be one that is multitalented, spiritually gifted, held in high esteem by the church family, and able to communicate in a sincere and loving way. He will provide ministerial care and coordination of the areas essential to the health and spiritual growth of our church family. Church planning, spiritual growth development, counseling, visitations, teaching, mentoring, and ministries coordination are all a part of his responsibilities. In his preaching, we will look to him to use God's Word to remind the church of God's calling and expectations. Though not directly facilitating every aspect of church function, he is viewed as the minister that has his finger on the pulse of all church activity. If our church family were a cruise line (we will use this analogy in each article), he might be seen as the captain of the ship; keeping the boat on course, the passengers safe, and everything running smoothly. This minister is a person that is mature, interpersonally and professionally skilled, grounded in the Word, and not easily tossed about by the winds and waves of life. The Shepherds see Derrick Busch as just such an individual, and look forward to him filling this role.

Derrick demonstrates all the qualities that are needed to serve as our Pastoral Care Minister. Outside of church circles, *pastoral care* has been defined as "emotional and spiritual support" and "helping acts directed toward the healing, sustaining, guiding, and reconciling of troubled persons..." This is our brother, Derrick! In his part-time work with the church over many years, he has proven his desire and effectiveness in the areas of teaching, counseling, mentoring, organizing, and preaching. We know that Derrick is a humble, servant-hearted team player. God has prepared him for this moment in ways that we all recognize, and ways that He will further reveal to both Derrick and the church family. The elders are confident in this decision, and trust that Derrick will be a guiding influence at Pitman Road for years to come.

France Mission Trip Coming Up-Trip # 8

Our church is faithful to the "Great Commission." As a matter of fact, it is one of our Core Values! "We have the responsibility to share the gospel of Jesus Christ, make disciples, baptize believers, and model God's love." (Matt. 28:18-20; Matt. 22:37-39, Mark 16:15-16)

We are serious about spreading the good news of Jesus Christ around the world. Of course, that sharing of the good news starts right here in South Jersey. Over the last three decades, the "good news sharing" has called for both our dollars and our volunteer spirit. Our members send money around the world to proclaim Christ. And, our members have traveled the world...to China, to Panama, to Tanzania to Haiti, to Honduras, to Peru, to China, to Japan, to Ghana, and France, to proclaim Christ!

Our next mission trip is to France, coming up on June 21-30. We have between 25 and 30 eager volunteers ready to go. About half of the volunteers this year are from our congregation right here at Pitman Road, and the other half are from around the nation, with most of them coming from Nebraska. What can you do to help? First and foremost, you can pray for both our effectiveness and our safety. (If you've noticed the news lately, France is experiencing more than a little unrest.) Second, some in our group still need money to help pay for their trip, so you can see me if you'd like to make a donation. Total cost for the trip is just under \$2,000. (We take no money out of the church contributions to support this trip.) Third, maybe you can volunteer to drive our group up to Newark International Airport in the church van on Friday, June 21; or to pick us up on Sunday, June 30. Let me know if you can help!

Finally, begin now to plan to join us on our next mission trip, in June, 2021. Typically, I lead these mission trips to France every other year, (odd numbered years), during the last full week of June.


