Letter from Debbie Lancaster to The Members at Pitman Road Church of Christ- May 26, 2019 Good Morning to you, My Brothers and Sisters in Christ, at Pitman Road,

I want to take this opportunity to thank this church body for all you have done for Max and me over these past four months. In January, following our first-in-our-lifetime cruise, I was diagnosed with Pneumonia. In the week following, my breathing deteriorated further. I entered UPenn ER diagnosed with Influenza A. This flu wanted to kill me at times, for I would be on the floor gasping for air. Perhaps some of you have had breathing issues and know about this. It is akin to a drowning feeling. Several times, Max thought I was not going to make it through the breathing spasms. At times, I did not help by telling Max I was going to die that night! Overall, I went to ER three times, hospitalized once, saw more doctors than I have fingers and toes, had more CAT Scans than there are days in the week, and more blood tests than there are stars in the sky. (Or so it seemed!) Over February, March, and April, Influenza subsided, but evolved into Asthma, and then into severe Bronchitis. UPenn Doctors at this point indicated they really were not sure exactly what my diagnosis was, as Influenza morphs into all sorts of strange lung/breathing issues. On May 1, their plan was a very high dosage of a steroid, Prednisone, for a month and then review. Prednisone makes me cry at the drop of a hat about absolutely nothing. And, makes me eat all the time! Max was with me every step of the way and that was not easy. He would push me to stop talking (Really tough!), to rest, to understand that this was rugged now, but would pass over time. Actually, I may be a little hyper like Dan Cooper because I always awoke early to go to the gym, swim my one mile, walk my 12K steps, but not these last four months. Major fatigue and breathing failure was my daily foe. Our UPenn review was this past Thursday and I have sharply improved. I will continue to take my "beloved" Prednisone at a declining rate for another five weeks, and hopefully normalcy will have returned. I will even welcome those facial wrinkles back that Prednisone fixed temporarily! This is how the servants of Jesus Christ from Pitman Road Church of Christ saved my life. As Dan preached recently, "Are you prepared to serve?" This church began praying for us. It began with our Tuesday ladies Bible class, LIFE Groups, my secret sister, men's prayer groups, men's Bible class, the Elders, preachers, and many more of you. I know this because you sent us cards telling us you were praying on my behalf. You came to our home in Monmouth County to be with me when Max needed to go to work, you brought a week of home cooked meals multiple times; you had food delivered from our local restaurants. A beautiful basket of goodies was delivered with my favorite teas, soups, candies and cookies, gift cards to feel better and go out to eat, and great books to help pass my quiet times. Each time I would be discouraged, you lifted me up. All of the cards, texts, and phone call were so appreciated. This church has proven "You are created for service". You were called and equipped to help save my life.

I love you ALL. - Debbie PS: We closed this week on a home just 6 minutes from this building!


