How often do we sit quietly?

"The Battle is Real!" (Part 1)

How often do we sit quietly? I Imagine two very different responses to this question. One response might be, "You mean in the 21st century with all of my "must-do" stuff, in a world that both awards and values the best "multi-tasker" with the trophy and the accolades? Who has time to simply sit quietly and miss out on the trophy and accolades? Sitting quietly?" Another response might be, "I sit quietly often as I check Facebook, hit-up Twitter, check emails, and watch my favorite episodes of Matlock." I really enjoy Matlock, but let me not digress. Let's define this place of quietness. The best way to define it might be to state what it's not. This place of quietness involves the absence of our widely accepted cultural life-lines such as: our cell phones, cable TV blaring in the background as we select our favorite reruns and new features on Hulu, Amazon Fire Stick, Netflix, CBS All Access, and not to exclude the Xbox and Play Station crew. Oh, and my crew that listens to music through an assortment of ear-pieces as people yell at them to get their attention BE-CAUSE THEIR MUSIC IS LOUDER THAN LOUD! This list could go on and on.
