God is Depending on You to Partner with Him

How does that make you feel? We can either agree to be partners with God, or we can refuse to partner with God. Paul reminded the Christians in Corinth and us as well, "For we are God's fellow workers" (1 Cor. 3:9). There may be people that will never be reached for Christ unless you and I agree to this partnership with God. That realization simultaneously frightens me and thrills me. I can allow God to partner with me, or I can refuse such a partnership! That is a sobering thought.

Not sure what else he did, but there is a story of a man by the name of Ananias mentioned in Acts 9. Ananias partnered with God! Ananias was instrumental in the conversion of "Saul the persecutor." Ananias was the partner that God used to convert Paul (See Acts 9:10-18). Imagine that! This one man made an eternal difference. 
Adorned: Living out the Beauty of the Gospel Together


