"Reboot & Rejoice!"

When you hear the word, "Reboot," what comes to mind? I'm assuming for most of us, we would say "Computer!" Well, it doesn't take long if you've used a computer for any length of time before you experience any number of the following un-pleasantries associated with using a computer: freezing, slow-downs, or it just simply shuts-down for no apparent reason and without reason. Now, for my techie friends, please excuse my elementary or even incorrect terminology. Let's just say, "The thing just won't work!" 
