## Quick Update: Elders / Ministers Annual "Shore" Meeting!

For most of the last 35 years, your elders and ministers have been "going to the shore" each Fall, to both reflect and to plan, pray, and prepare for the coming year(s). Over those years, we have met in at least four different homes, provided by generous host families. John Rucker, Jim Daniel, Frank Rizzuto, and I attended the first planning meeting. Since that first meeting, over four dozen elders, deacons, and ministers have attended those meetings. It is always one of my favorite week-ends of the year!

This year, we did not meet at the shore! None of our regular shore meeting locations were available. Camp Manatawny invited us to use their wonderful facilities and they hosted our meeting there. We had beautiful weather, wonderful food, great facilities, and we addressed some tough issues, even as a wonderful spirit characterized the meeting, beginning to end. I love our elders.

Among the many items that we observed is that people are dying and people are moving out of NJ, and our church statistics reflect that fact. In the last ten years, we have lost 59 people due to moves out of state. During that same time, we have lost 22 people due to deaths. Obviously, we had no control over either of those.

So, what is our response to be? We believe that God always does His best work in the midst of difficult times. We believe that God placed us here "for such a time as this" and we must not keep silent (Esther 4:14). Among other things, we (the elders and ministers) are planning to meet individually with members (MWM). As our banners say, we are committing to connect with JESUS, FAMILY, and OTHERS. We are "all in" on our mission of meeting people where they are and together being transformed into the image of Christ. Also, be watching for an exciting new emphasis on what happens "Between the Sundays!"

Determined to help our church be...a place where God's love is experienced, known, and shared by all! And your participation in this process is vital.

# We're All A Mess

"How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth" (Psalm 119:103)

I'm developing, with GREAT pleasure and spiritual fulfillment the habit of reading the Psalm that matches the date. For example, today is October 20<sup>th</sup>. So, sometime today I will find a quiet place and read and journey with Psalm 20. Obviously this way of taking in the Word of God did not originate with me; perhaps this is your practice already. If it is, please let me know and let's encourage one another to continue! Now, I must be transparent and let you know that I do struggle with consistency. But, if I miss a day using this method, I simply pick-up with whatever day it is! I love living a "non-legalistic" life!

So, on October 11<sup>th</sup> I read and journaled with *Psalm 11*. What a blessing! God's Word is so sweet! The words and phrases that impacted and challenged me at the time were: In the LORD I take refuge... ...the upright in heart..., "The LORD is in His holy temple; the LORD is on His heavenly throne. "For the LORD is righteous, He loves justice; the upright will see His face," just to point out a few.

For brevity sake, I was ultimately challenged by verse one, "In the LORD I take refuge." I asked myself, if I truly take refuge (my safety, my protection) in the LORD, the world around and possibly even the company that I keep will question this stance and even encourage me to take refuge in something else instead of my LORD; even if it's encouragement to take refuge in my plans that direct my heart away from my ultimate refuge; the LORD!

This Psalm is very real! It calls me (and you) to take refuge in the LORD even in the very real midst of danger from others, when the foundations as we know them are being destroyed, because the LORD promises that the upright will see His face. This method of taking in the Word of God leads to this conclusion, "How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth." (Psalm 119:103)



Wednesday, October 30


Two great events for children and their families! Same-day, here at Pitman Road. Invite someone! Invitations available at the Welcome Center. Both events, rain or shine.
