JANUARY

First Family Promise Host Week of the new year, coordinated by John Ashton. Andy Mychajlowycz is announced by the Camp Manatawny board as Executive Director at camp in 2020. First Craft Day of the new year, coordinated by Dottie Grillo and Janet Betts. First Book Club of the new year, coordinated by Brenda Busch and Gloria Myerson. First Refuge of the year; First speaker of 2020 was our intern, Jackson House. Dan and Joey dropped off homemade baked treats to the Pitman and Mantua Police Departments for Law Enforcement Day. Thank you to Tim and Melody Davis and the teens for making the goodies!

FEBRUARY

"Souper" Super Sunday Pre-Game Party in the FLC; thanks to Tony and Stephanie DeStefano and Larry and Lisa Peterson for coordinating the event. Winterfest: chaperoned by many, teens involved, about 30 people in attendance. Refuge; Speaker was Esther Young.

MARCH

Annual Secret Sisters Revealing Party, hosted by Debby Durham, coordinated by Dottie Grillo. National pandemic COVID-19 causes halt to in-person service and activities, and results in quarantine. Sunday church service goes online Sunday, March 22. Our intern, Jackson, starts a Sunday Bible class on Facebook Live. Robin Steward starts sending out Orange materials for parents and caretakers to use with their children to keep them engaged. The church sets up a COVID-19 Assistance Fund, where members continued to give generously throughout 2020.

APRIL

Family Promise Host Week is modified due to COVID; families stayed at the Day Center, but our members still provided meals and shopped for their pantry. Some LIFE groups use Zoom to stay connected virtually, and Dan uses Facebook LIVE to hold a class on Wednesday nights. Diana Hutchinson and Brenda Busch start women's prayer groups on Zoom. Derrick Busch coordinates a men's prayer group over Zoom. The Camp Manatawny Board makes the official decision to cancel all 2020 summer sessions. Callie Peacher starts doing a short lesson and activity on stage with her sons Josiah, Jonah, and Finn for the kids at home to watch online.

MAY

First Men's Prayer Time outside under the car port due to social distancing. College seniors graduate virtually. A special Mother's Day video is put together to make our virtual Sunday service special. Dan starts our member video series called "Opening up...when we're shut down!" to keep us connected during this time of being physically apart. He will go on to do over 100 interviews in 2020!

JUNE

High school seniors graduate virtually. Diana Hutchinson and Desna Yanzuk coordinates the baby bottle campaign for Choices of the Heart.

JULY

Family Promise Host Week is once again modified due to COVID; families stayed at the Day Center, but our members still provided meals and shopped for their pantry. Tim and Melody Davis step down from their role as Youth Group leaders after years of dedication; Manny and Becky Vander Vennen take over as new youth leaders. Mandy Mansdoerfer coordinates another successful blood drive. Camp Manatawny directors, summer staff, and other volunteers amazingly create virtual camp. We begin to discuss reopening options for in-person service.

AUGUST

Dan starts a new Sunday Bible class series on Facebook Live and YouTube. The decision is made to start safe and limited in-person worship again on Sunday, August 16. Online options are still equally encouraged. A longtime member of our church offers a \$5,000 matching gift challenge.

SEPTEMBER

Katherine Cooper resumes a socially distanced Tuesday morning women's class in the FLC. Another successful Baby Bottle Campaign is wrapped up, and \$2,218.57 was collected and given by our members.

OCTOBER

Our last Family Promise Host Week for the year 2020. Members continue to bless the families by cooking and shopping, even with the modifications due to COVID. A socially distanced Trunk or Treat and Movie Night takes place at the building. A Secret Sister Brunch (food prepared by Andrea Olley) is held in the large, new classroom on Halloween.

NOVEMBER

Handmade Thanksgiving cards (made with love by Janet Betts and her team) are signed and sent out. Pack the Pulpit food collection provides over 50 families with Thanksgiving dinner baskets. Tina Broyles coordinates annual collection of "shoeboxes" for Operation Christmas Child; over 100 boxes are filled by members. Andrea Olley coordinates "Adopt a West Point Cadet" to bless cadets with Christmas boxes. Dan teaches a two part series on Sunday morning on appointing new elders. A new matching gift challenge for \$10,000 is offered and our members continue to give generously. The last Craft Day in 2020, always coordinated by Dottie Grillo, is held in the FLC. Many members of all ages participate in Cardboard Testimony Sunday, sharing one physical blessing and one spiritual blessing.

DECEMBER

A COVID safe cookie exchange is held at the building. Dan Cooper becomes the first man to attend (and yes, he made his own cookies). Gift bags and snacks are collected and given to the single women staying at Eleanor Corbett House. American Red Cross Blood Drive, coordinated by Mandy Mansdoerfer, with a goal of 30 units; 35 units are collected. Maggie Mansdoerfer coordinates, collects, and delivers items to Veteran Haven. We close out 2020 with our first Pitman Road Christmas Show, hosted by Mike Broyles and put together by Will Mendez and Anthony DeStefano.
