FAITHFUL RESPONSE

The Psalms are a variety of honest prayers to God. Many are questions we want to voice but are sometimes afraid to ask. Psalm 13 is a good example of this. David bluntly asks God questions. David is struggling. Sorrow is overwhelming him, and he is questioning God's care and protection. David's problems are big too. Soldiers chasing him to kill him. Hiding in the wilderness from his enemies. Here are the words of his heart:

O Lord, how long will you forget me? Forever? How long will you look the other way? How long must I struggle with anguish in my soul, with sorrow in my heart every day? How long will my enemy have the upper hand? (Psalm 13:1-2)

What usually happens when people start questioning God like this, when hard, unexplainable things occur, is our hearts harden towards God. We may slip into depression. We may lash out at the people around us. We may even abandon him. I've been there at the edge of an emotional cliff. Maybe you have too. That's why the end of Psalm 13 is a refreshing surprise.

But I trust in your unfailing love. I will rejoice because you have rescued me. I will sing to the Lord because he is good to me. (Psalm 13:5-6)

David begins talking about God's blessings and love. He begins to sing. Isn't it bad timing for a rousing praise song? One moment he tells God he feels abandoned and the next he is singing about his goodness. The emotion is there, but does the timing seem odd? Maybe it's just the right time for bursting out in praise of God. These two verses of this Psalm are connected by faith.

Jesus followers are supposed to be all about faith. Faith doesn't wait for answers to the questions or for the sadness to depart. Faith sings in the middle of the unknown darkness that surrounds. Faith sings while chained to a wall, like Paul and Silas. Faith sings when there's nothing left to do but hit your knees and trust in God. Faith clings tightly to what we believe, but do not see: Jesus, what's he's done for us, and his return to us. Faith knows that when Christ died on the cross over 2000 years ago, God's strategic rescue plan for humanity took place.

One of the best ways to express the Good News about Jesus is how we handle things when life causes us to question God.

We look above to him. We bring our questions to him and then we faithfully sing to him.
