#### THERE'S AN A.P.P. FOR THAT!

[A PEACHER'S PERSPECTIVE]

#### FILLED WITH JOY, HATED BY THE WORLD

Later this month, a group of both teens and adults will head to Gatlinburg for the annual trip to Winterfest. I will attend my first Winterfest with this group. This year's theme is "The Hour Has Come" and revolves around Jesus' prayer in John 17. There are devotionals built around this prayer during the Winterfest days, and devotionals to prepare your heart ahead of time. I'm interested to see the direction the discussions go, but one passage struck me as I read through John 17:

I told them many things while I was with them in this world so they would be filled with my joy. I have given them your word. And the world hates them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. (John 17:13-14)

Jesus is speaking the night before He died. He gathered His closest friends to tell them His final words. Part of those words were a prayer for them to continue in joy without Him. There would be grief, confusion, maybe blame. They would question the wisdom of giving Himself up and not calling on the legions of angels at His disposal. Like a parent reminding his or her child that there is a method behind the madness, Jesus wants them to remember that

everything He said and did was for them. He says, "I told them many things, SO they would be filled with joy." His messages, discussions, answers, prayers, and miracles provide a plethora of memories to rely on when life gets hard. Jesus knows they will fall apart and go their separate ways. The disciples would flee, deny, doubt when He did return, hide from the world, and return to what they knew. When circumstances got difficult and Jesus was no longer around to hold them together, they would falter. He knows life will get hard.

I wonder what John thought as he reflected on these words of Jesus decades later when he organized his gospel. By then, John had lost all his friends and family. His brother had been killed early on because of his allegiance to Jesus. John sits on a small island in the Mediterranean Sea because he has been exiled for his allegiance to Jesus. He has experienced the hatred of the world, yet the words of his books and letters are full of joy.

This prayer is mere minutes after Jesus redefines the Passover meal as a memorial moment for Him. What did John think at the Passover eleven months after Jesus disappeared into the sky? What about sixty years later when he writes his gospel? Every time John celebrated pivotal moments in his people's history, he remembered Jesus. Just as bad moments occurred since Jesus left, many good ones did, too. The church expanded by thousands and into the farthest reaches of the Roman Empire. A vicious persecutor of Christians named Saul had become one of their most ardent defenders. Hearts had been softened. Lives had been changed.

John was able to endure the hardships of his life because he focused on the joy of victory in Jesus. It was no mistake that the last thing Jesus said to all His disciples before He prayed for them in their presence were these words: "I have told you all this so that you may have peace in me. Here on earth you will have many trials and sorrows. But take heart because I have overcome the world." (John 16:33)

The reminder of hardships in the world buffers the difficulties when they come. We expect them and can be ready for them. Jesus left us with His Spirit and His words compiled by His closest friends to give us peace and joy despite the hatred of the world. The future is full of good and bad experiences. As Jesus overcomes the world, so can we.


