#### MORE THAN THE LUCK OF THE IRISH

This letter is from Paul and Timothy, slaves of Christ Jesus. - Philippians 1:1

And we know that God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love God and are called according to his purpose for them. – Romans 8:28

March 17<sup>th</sup> is St. Patrick's Day. There will be parades, festivals, and lots of beer drinking. Rivers turn green. People pinch each other for not wearing green. It has become a celebration of Irish American culture. In Ireland, until the 1960s, bars were forbidden to open on St. Patrick's Day because it was viewed as a religious holiday. There will be decorations of shamrocks, leprechauns, and signs of good luck hanging in stores, but there's more to the story of St. Patrick than the luck of the Irish and a better reason to remember and celebrate this great follower of Jesus.

"Patrick was born into Roman citizenship on the British Isles in 387. As a boy, he was sold to a cruel Druid and taken to work in Northern Ireland. Although Patrick had been raised

with the Christian faith as part of his family's lifestyle, he had no true knowledge of God, no interest in Jesus, and certainly no desire to live a holy Christian life. That changed when he became a slave. Patrick spent years learning the language and culture of the Druids. Beneath the barbaric practices of the religion common to Ireland, which may even have included human sacrifice, Patrick saw the beauty of people made in the image of God."

After years in bondage, Patrick would escape and return home, but he did not forget the people of Ireland. He returned to his captors, sought out his former master, paid his ransom price, and spoke about Jesus. "On Easter of 433, Patrick found himself engaging in a spiritual duel of sorts with the Druid priests and magicians. Patrick had lit an Easter fire, a bonfire traditionally lit on the evening before Easter morning that symbolizes the light of Christ and His resurrection. (Cool symbolism for an outdoor worship service, right?) The Druids could not extinguish it. They called down a demonic darkness. Patrick dispelled it with prayer." Part of that prayer could have been this:

Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ in me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me... Through a mighty strength, the invocation of the Trinity, Through a belief in the Threeness, Through a confession of the Oneness Of the Creator of creation.

"One of the legends surrounding the life of Saint Patrick says that he drove all the snakes off the island. Truth be told, there is no evidence that Ireland ever had any snakes (New Zealand, Iceland, and Greenland are also snake-free). Patrick did not drive literal snakes from Ireland, but by his work and witness, the serpent-like stranglehold of Druid superstition was loosened and eventually driven out. In Patrick's enslavement, the snake of paganism had struck at Patrick's heel, but Christ in the end had crushed its head. Somehow, in the evil that had been done to him in his kidnapping and enslavement, Patrick found his calling. Evil had been turned to good. The runaway slave had retuned a free man, a slave of Christ, and a servant of the Irish people."

Like Paul and Timothy, Patrick would use his experiences and give them over to Jesus. The fun of wearing green and getting pinched pales in comparison to the real reason to have St. Patrick's Day as a transition celebration between Christmas and Easter. Patrick became a new life in Jesus and impacted an entire culture for Jesus. That's a good reason to celebrate.

\$4 processing fee on all registrations. \$50 (non-refundable) deposit REQUIRED at time of registration. Balance must be PAID IN FULL prior to start of session.





**First-Time Camper Discount:** All first-time campers are welcomed with a **\$50 discount**.

**Multi-Child Discount:** Families that register more than two campers from their immediate family or legal guardian will receive a **\$40 discount per additional camper.** Applies to the 3rd or more child.


**Multi-Week Discount:** Only applies to campers who have completed grades 4 through 9. If attending more than one week, **the second week is \$100 off**.
