[A PEACHER'S PERSPECTIVE]

BRUTAL HISTORY AND BEAUTIFUL ART

We recently visited the Holocaust Museum in Washington D.C. The brutality of sinful humanity is clearly on display as the horrors of torture, death, and the ultimate endgame of an evolutionary worldview is displayed in pictures and video footage. Among the gruesome accounts of attempted genocide are also stories of people who survived and helped others survive and stories of those who tried to rescue as many as they could. Small lights within gargantuan darkness, but lights, nonetheless. Rescuers among men are successful to a limited degree. Read the book of Judges if you don't believe me.

Within 24 hours of visiting the Holocaust Museum, we visited the Museum of the Bible (which is a must see, if you haven't heard me say that yet) for a special exhibit focused on the ultimate rescuer: Jesus. The exhibit titled, Ecce Homo, displayed artwork of the face of Jesus mostly at the moment when Pilate parades his beaten body before a crowd and declares, "Behold, the man" (Ecce Homo in Latin). One of these by Salvador Dali (shown below) fascinated me because when I first saw it, I saw only splatter. Dali, in fact, used a technique called "bulletism," which involves loading a type of antique aun

with ink capsules and firing them at the paper. Only later, from a distance, did I recognize the image of Jesus. There was also a woodcutting done by an artist of whom very little work survives because the Nazis felt his work deaenerate. One of the images reminded us of the emaciated bodies seen the previous day in the Holocaust Museum. The juxtaposition of these two exhibits reminds me of both the reality and the beauty of Easter.

The Resurrection is the day that took things that were broken, cruel, harsh, ugly, and repulsive and made them beautiful again. The Resurrection is redemption. The Resurrection is transformation. The Resurrection does not

make the reality of Jesus's suffering and death by crucifixion a little less barbaric. The suffering and pain were real because Jesus was real. When Pilate declared, "Behold, the man," he didn't realize he was declaring a theological truth: that our God became flesh and suffered our pain and our death in our place. Jesus took my place on the cross. Visuals over the centuries help bring that reality to life. Yet, like the accounts of the Holocaust survivors who lived into their nineties, the reality of the suffering was not the end of the story.

The Resurrection is so powerful and so transformative that it takes ugly images of sadness and pain and reforms them into images of redemption. The resurrection turns manaled images of a man tortured to death into images worthy of adoration and worship. The resurrection helps see splatters of paint on paper as something worthy of reflection.

We can be certain of Jesus' resurrection and live transformed lives, too. Images like the one to the right remind us of Jesus' death in our place, but they can also remind of the transformative beauty and power of the resurrection. Happy Easter!
