A Few Moments with Merle

Loneliness

Loneliness. We have all felt it at one time or another. One study suggests twenty-five percent of respondents admitted to being lonely within the preceding few weeks. Over one in ten admitted to being "severely lonely" over the last week. We just came through the holidays, a time of extreme loneliness for many people.

Loneliness does not have to be a wasted moment for us. From loneliness can arise at least two positive results; we can make these observations from 2 Timothy 4:9-22: **First, it makes us aware of others' significance.** The apostle Paul may have never appreciated Dr. Luke so much as he did in the dungeon. Luke was the only one with Paul, the only one who could assist with his physical needs. Paul even viewed John Mark in a different light. In Acts 15 we find that he had little respect for the one he considered a deserter. John Mark had deserted Paul in Pamphylia while on his first missionary journey. The truth is, we need one another. A Barbara Streisand song proclaims, "People who need people are the *luckiest* people in the world." But the lyrics don't go far enough. The fact is, people who need people are the *only* people in the world. I am glad that those of you who read this article are in my life. I need you. I want to be a blessing in your life

The second benefit of loneliness is that it forces us to turn our concern over to God. Even though Paul had been wronged by Alexander the coppersmith, he left the matter to God, who would repay his opponent according to his deeds (vs. 14). Even though he could have worried over the circumstances holding him in prison, he focused on the Lord's ability to deliver him and His capability to keep him safe (vs. 18) Why not turn your problem or circumstance over to the One "who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine." (Ephesians 3:20)

Let me go ahead and say here.....WOW!! Once again, I was overwhelmed with the generosity of your Christmas financial gift to Debby and me and of your expressions of love and appreciation for me and my ministry to this church. Thank you! You are the best. I look forward to the year ahead. The best is yet to be.

AN UPDATE FROM OUR MISSIONARIES IN FRANCE...READ AND PRAY!

Dear Family in Christ,

Many of you have contacted me in the last few days asking for news and for direction in prayer in the aftermath of the terrible terrorist attacks in Paris. Thank you so much for your thoughts and prayers!

What is Happening

First, while we are safe and sound in Marseille, far away from the theatre of these tragic events in Paris, the fallout of the worst terrorist attack in France in over 50 years will be important. While there is no comparison with the scale of what took place in the US on 9/11, this is,



in a sense, France's version of 9/11.

At the children's club at church Friday, I spoke with one of the women (atheist) who brings her daughter each week, and she talked of being on the verge of an anxiety attack.

Saturday, as I drove past our neighborhood synagogue, a visible police presence protected the Sabbath worship time there.

The gatherings in all the major cities in France yesterday were attended by nearly 4 million people. The largest gathering in France's history! You have no doubt seen, even in the US, the *Je suis Charlie* signs, in solidarity of the victims of the first attack, (the second took the lives of 4 people in a kosher store.)

This solidarity has a biblical tie. While Jesus did not wear a sign on his back, he did, indeed, humble himself and become one of us. Let us never forget that as we serve those around us.

A Few Statistics

France is the home of the largest Muslim population in Europe at 6 million (10% of the population). Marseille has the largest Muslim population by percentage of any city in Europe (25%) or over 300,000.

For Your Prayers

In this time of insecurity, please pray that we would be bold in proclaiming and living the love of Christ and the confidence we have in God. We are in contact with so many Muslims. Now is the time, more than ever, to love them and reach out to them. In this time of anxiety, pray that we speak words from the God of all comfort (2 Cor 1:3) at every opportunity.

Pray for the perpetrators and the victims.

The Perpetrators: Those responsible for the attacks were radicalized (at least in part) in French prisons! I regularly see three young men (on the soccer field and/or at church!)

who have spent time in prison in Marseille. **Pray for conviction of sin instead of hardness of heart.** The three I know are well aware of their sin and are repentant. This saves them from a radical ideology, and, I believe, will bring them all to transformed lives in Christ.

The Victims: As the attack was against the press, it is taken as an attack on all of France, on the specific value of Freedom of expression. While we indeed stand for freedom, as Christians this has a very specific meaning. Galatians 5:13 says: «"You, my brothers and sisters were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge your sinful nature; rather, serve one another humbly in love." Pray that we may use our freedom to serve others humbly in love.




ANNUAL CORPORATE MEETING

- If you are not a Secret Sister and would like to join, or if you need to update your information please see me for a guestionnaire.




Transportation: If you would like to car pool or ride in the church van, please meet at the bldg. at 12:15. Brittany will be driving the van.
