You really are... "just a vapor that appears for a little while..."

In the last ten days I have been brought face to face with death and dying. As a minister, that is no surprise, but what is shocking about these three deaths is that they were not old people!

Jessica was only 31. From the time she was diagnosed with cancer to the day she died, less than one year passed. Shocking! No words to describe the loss! The funeral home was full last Thursday as folks gathered from the local community and fourteen states to celebrate her life.

Randy was only 58, he appeared to be in perfect health. He looked to be in better shape than most men his age, was retired military, and served as an elder in the church. In past years, he had served as a deacon in our church. The Friday night before he passed, Randy and his wife took a ride in a convertible with the top down, enjoyed the 80 degree temperatures and snapped photos.

John was only 60. He was a first responder in New York City. During his career he received numerous citations. He was among the first responders on site at the World Trade Center on September 11th and present when Twin Towers fell. By nature a servant, he served in any way he could at Ground Zero. Unfortunately, his service there left him with terminal cancer. Even in death he continued to serve by donating his body for medical research. I was there with his sweet, devoted wife last Wednesday when she picked up his ashes from the medical school of the University of Pennsylvania.

A sobering reality....as illustrated by a 31 year old, a 58 year old, and a 60 year old... "You do not know what your life will be like tomorrow. You are just a vapor that appears for a little while and then vanishes away. You ought to say, 'If the Lord wills, we will live and do this or that'" (James 4:13-15) -Dan the "Vaporman"

Jesus Really Meant It

There are these red letters in the Bible; they only appear in the New Testament, specifically in the first four books. Why red? Who thought of it? The idea of printing Jesus' words in red began with a man named Louis Klopsch. He served as the editor of the Christian Herald magazine. The first red -letter Bible was published in 1899. Klopsch thought of red to symbolize the blood of Jesus Christ. You can read more about Klopsch & the origin of red-letter Bibles at http://www.crossway.org/ blog/2006/03/red-letter-origin/.

I love the fact that God placed that idea on Klopsch's heart. There is something special about reading one of the books that tell the story of Jesus and allowing those red letters to stand out and penetrate your heart and mind. Those red letters are His words. They are powerful words. They are healing words. They are true words. Jesus said many things. Things that we sometimes take for granted or even don't take seriously. Like "love your enemies," "sell your possessions and give to the poor," "whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant," "if the world hates you, keep in mind that it hated me first" and much more.

Recently 21 Egyptian Christians were persecuted and executed in Libya because they followed Jesus. Jesus spoke of this in John 16: 1-3.

"All this I have told you so that you will not go astray. They will put you out of the synagogue; in fact, a time is coming when anyone who kills you will think he is offering a service to God."

Jesus really meant this and it is really happening. My heart is heavy for the families of the 21 martyrs. Following Jesus is not supposed to be safe or comfortable. We don't usually tell this to people when they decide to give their lives to God. We should. It's what Jesus told us will happen. For now, pray for those being persecuted, pray for those through whom the persecution is coming, pray about what we can do to fight evil and injustice, and pray we do not grow comfortable and safe.

Out of the Mouths of Babes!





Finally someone guessed correctly that Dwight was one of the elders. So, we had a little lesson on who the elders were, and collectively we named them all. We also listed the names of the ministers. Someone thought Steve Pierre-Jacques was a minister, but we straightened it all out. Eventually we got a bit into the lesson, until it was obvious that their attention spans had been maxed out, so, I asked one of the kids to put on a movie. I asked for a movie about Nehemiah. As she was putting the movie in, I asked her if she knew who Nehemiah was? She replied, "He was the King's Cupbearer in the times of Babylon Captivity and he.....etc etc.....well, it became obvious that she knew a whole lot more about Nehemiah than most adults I know!!!


