

Lunch with Two of our Seasoned Citizens

This past week, Merle (Glynn) and I had the distinct pleasure of treating two of our widow ladies to lunch. One of the ladies was 88 years old and the other was 78. As we were about to finish our lunch, the 88 year old looked over at a long table sitting off to one side and said, "Did you see that group of elderly folks sitting over there, I wonder where they are from?" Somehow, that struck me as funny! Talk about the pot calling the kettle black! Of course I couldn't laugh out loud, but I thought to myself, how interesting. An 88 year old commenting about a group of "elderly folks" over at that other table!

Two reflections: 1) To the 88 year old sitting at our table, sound in mind and body, those "elderly folks" with their wheel chairs and grey hair were old. The four people...in their 60's, 70's and 80's at our table were not! It is all about perspective. I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me (Phil. 4:13). If you really want to be a more engaged, faithful, connected disciple of Jesus Christ, you can be. It is all about perspective...and desire! How do you see yourself?

2) Spending time with our seasoned citizens can be a huge blessing. Looking out for our widows is all about God's kingdom, God's work, and loving others as we have been loved by Him. It's all about helping others to "experience" God's love...the young, the middle aged and the "elderly folks." You can be religious in the very best sense of the word...you can practice "pure religion" (James 1:27). We can do this people. In fact, we must because we want this church to be the place where God's love is experienced, known and shared by all!

Shepherd's Voice

Question: "Is it good to have close friendships with unbelievers?"

The book of Proverbs (12:26) discuses befriending non-believers. One is "The righteous should choose his friends carefully, for the way of the wicked leads them astray". But in Mark 12:31 scripture says "You must love your neighbor as yourself."

The short answer is both are correct. We have two types of friends, Close Friends—people you spend a great deal of time with (outside of a job or other forced time), and Acquaintance Friends - These are usually more shallow in terms of emotions and bonds, and you probably don't confide personal things to them.

So should we form a deep bond with someone who rejects our Lord? Not according to the Bible. God said in 1 Corinthians 15:33: "Bad company corrupts good character." Although close relationships are not recommended, it does not mean we turn our noses up and ignore unbelievers. 2 Timothy 2:24-26 tells us that "as servants of the Lord, we are to be kind to and not quarrel with anyone."

Many people have been saved because of the prayers and service of Christians, so don't turn your back on unbelievers. But, having any kind of intimate relationship with an unbeliever can quickly and easily turn into something that is a hindrance to your walk with Christ. We are called to evangelize the lost, not be intimate with them. There is nothing wrong with building quality friendships with unbelievers – but the primary focus of such a relationship should be to win them to Christ by sharing the Gospel with them and demonstrating God's saving power in our own lives.

Highlights from the Report: "The past couple of months have been fairly difficult for me personally. It started in early December when I flew out to Florida to officiate at my nephew's wedding. The day before the wedding, my mother, who was visiting from Arkansas, took ill and had to be rushed to the hospital. To make a long story short, she was diagnosed with stage three ovarian cancer. I ended up spending three weeks in December in Orlando helping my sister to care for her while she was hospitalized.
