Hope May Come in a Whisper

Have you been feeling depressed?

If so, you are not alone. Some of God's greatest servants have struggled with depression. In my journey through the Old Testament this week I came across the story of a man who was struggling with depression big time. He had just been instrumental in orchestrating a huge victory over the false prophets (1 Kings 18:20-40). But shortly after his triumphant victory, he became a hunted man. He was running for his life. He all but gave up. No wonder he was depressed...he had no food, no water, and wicked Jezebel was out to do him in (1 Kings 19:1-9).

He called out to God and said, "I have been very zealous for the Lord God of Hosts; I have pursued your covenant, and have torn down altars. I alone am left and they seek to take my life." (1 Kings 19:10). When did this happen? When was he feeling so dejected? Only days after he had routed the 450 false prophets of Baal.

In your own life, have you ever noticed that after a great feat or significant accomplishment, discouragement or even depression frequently follows? When that happens, do not be surprised. That is simply the way Satan works. Continue to look for God and He will reveal Himself. But, He may reveal himself in a surprising way. In this story, Elijah expected God to reveal himself in some dramatic and magnificent way. But God did not work that way! Rather, God revealed himself in a whisper (1 Kings 19:11-14). Surprising, but true!

So if you been feeling depressed or overwhelmed, listen for God to whisper words of hope and encouragement (Psalms 46:10).

A mother eagle built her nest on a ledge of rock, a rock that had jutted out over the steep and dangerous precipice. One day she laid four eggs and she and her mate sat on them until they hatched. Then began the task of feeding them. Both parents were involved in the endless search for field mice and the like to fill the beaks which never seemed satisfied. One day the mother returned to her nest, and was startled at what she found. Clinging to the edge of her nest with all of its might was one of her babies – below it a fall of more than 1,000 feet. The little bird could not fly yet, and if it let go it would be crushed by the 1,000 foot drop. Screaming, the mother flew toward her baby, but as she flew, the baby's strength ran out and it fell from the ridge. August. So plan on getting your breakfast and caffeine before you get to church on Sunday mornings.


