

Remembering Dad on Father's Day

One Saturday night, in the spring of my senior year in high school, I came home past curfew from a date. When I got into bed, I found it... a letter written by my Dad. It was the first, but not the last that I would receive from him.

Dad typed the letter on his old typewriter. He was a writer of a sports column (fishing and hunting) for newspapers and magazines and used the same old typewriter he used to type his articles. It was one and a half pages in length, single spaced.

Dad started out by thanking me for my help to him and the family over the years when Dad's health was poor. He complimented me for taking on a lot of responsibility other kids did not have to assume. He said I was very mature for my age. Dad told me he loved me, but not any more than any of my other five brothers and sisters. He also said that he noticed my oldest sister and I had not been as close in recent months, and he told me to, "find out why and take care of it."

Dad knew I planned to go to a Christian college (Harding) in the fall and I was considering preaching as my life's work. He said, "If you decide to work full time with the church or if you decide to dig ditches, I will encourage you and support you in your decision." He continued, "I am proud of you, and I know God will use you in a great way in whatever way you decide."

Can you see why I treasure that letter with those words from my dad? They were given just at the right time. Through those words, he still speaks, although he went to be with the Lord forty years ago.

Thanks, Dad, for writing that special letter to me. Thanks for telling me you loved me and to work on my relationship with my sister. Thanks for telling me you would support me in whatever I chose to do with my life, and for telling me you were proud of me.

Dad, I love you, too. And I miss you.
