Prayers for Safety or Prayers for Boldness and Courage?

In the world of hippo bites, AIDS, Muslim extremists, tropical diseases, stolen passports and mission trips...do we play it safe or are we to be bold and courageous?

God provides strength that we don't have on our own! As I was reading a few weeks ago from the book of Joshua, I was struck forcibly by his oft repeated entreaty to the Israelites to — "Be bold and courageous and do not be afraid." What made his entreaty so remarkable is that it flies in the face of the often repeated entreaty and attitude I hear expressed in nearly every family and church parting, prayer and admonition! I hear these words nearly every day - "Be Safe!" The earnest request we make to God is - "Keep us safe!" Our prayers for military people are for safety — not boldness or victory.

I can't remember the last time I heard a parent say to their children, or a preacher say to his congregation - "Now above all things, be bold and courageous. Don't waste your life living timidly and trying to preserve it. Jesus said that those who try to save their lives will lose them." Those whose main concern is to live safely may live longer, but they won't enjoy life nearly as much. They will die with regret for never having lived – for never having accomplished much. Nobody will remember them, or admire them, or try to be like them.

I wonder what would have happened if Joshua had told the Israelites, "Now above all, don't take any chances; no unnecessary risks; preserve your life at all costs; remember that coming back alive is much more important than victory; be sure to pack an umbrella; take an extra canteen. And, if you have to choose between taking an extra weapon and an extra pair of running shoes — by all means take the shoes in case you need to make a hasty retreat; the most essential thing to remember is caution; the minute you see that we may be losing, run for your life. Head for the hills."

Then, a few hundred years after Joshua, along comes the good king Hezekiah and says... "Be strong and courageous, do not be afraid nor be dismayed." (2 Chron.32:7)


